Conservationist of the Month Felicia Ortner

The Monroe Conservation Commission is pleased to recognize resident Felicia Ortner as Conservationist of the Month for November. Felicia has been a bear enthusiast for over 25 years. She has studied bear's life style, physiology, behavior and natural history through books, journals, workshops, and lectures. In the mid 1990's Felicia became a Docent at Connecticut's Beardsley Zoo and turned her passion for learning about bears into a passion for teaching about them. She developed an education program called the Bear Reality and expanded her audience from Zoo visitors to libraries, schools, nature centers, scouts and more. In 2002 she completed the CT DEP's Master Wildlife Conservationist (MWC) program. About a year and a half ago the DEP and the Bear Reality came together and Felicia started presenting bear education programs on behalf of the DEP's MWC program. So far, in 2009, Felicia has logged over 70 education hours and reached over 2200 people around the state and into NY. Felicia has been able to join the CT DEP on two Black Bear winter den checks and has attended the Wildlife Research Institute Black Bear Workshops in Ely MN four of the last five years. With the populations of Black Bear increasing through our state, Felicia hopes, "through outreach and education that these magnificent creatures will become better
